

Minnesota Sporting Clays Hall of Fame

Purpose: Honor those individuals for their outstanding shooting performance and/or their contributions to the MSC and Sporting Clays throughout their shooting career. Hall of Fame members represent the best of the best and are recognized by their peers for their efforts and commitment to the game.

Responsibilities and Rules 6-23-2019

MSC Board will select the individuals for the election committee.

MSC Board will place Hall of Fame candidates on the ballot with a simple majority vote of the entire board.

MSC Board with a simple majority vote may place any individual on the ballot whom they feel is deserving of such an award.

MSC Board may choose any method to conduct this vote.

MSC Board "will" place individuals who have accumulated a minimum of "300" points on the ballot. (exceptions may be made for candidates conduct)

MSC Board will leave an individual not inducted on the first ballot for a period of 3 years at which time the individual may be resubmitted to the board.

MSC Board will make final determination regarding any questions on point accumulation.

MSC Board will provide an annual ballot to the election committee for any candidates in that year. There is no requirement to consider additional candidates to the Hall of Fame each year.

MSC Board has set the time for the Hall of Fame induction to be at the State Sporting Clays Championship.

MSC will provide the election committee with a summary of the points accumulated and personal biography of the individual if available.

MSC Board may alter the requirements for consideration to be nominated to the Hall of Fame with a 2/3 majority vote.

MSC Board shall ensure that all information regarding the Hall of Fame is public and place on the website.

Election Committee

“12” Members shall make up the Hall of Fame Election Committee.

Election Committee members must be a Minnesota resident in good standing and NSCA member, in good standing, for the Prior 10 years.

To qualify, Election Committee member must be an active registered target shooter in Minnesota and have shot 300 registered targets within the prior 2 years.

Once selected if they remain a Mn resident and NSCA Member they may only be removed for reason of misconduct, their own request or with a 2/3 vote of the current MSC Board.

Committee member must return ballots in a timely fashion.

Election

Each member may vote for up to 2 individuals on the ballot.

Ballots not returned or filled out improperly will be considered a “NO” vote.

Candidate must receive a Minimum of 2/3's which would be “8” Votes to be selected for the Hall of Fame.

Mn NSCA Member rights

Any MN resident who is currently an NSCA Member may submit to the MSC Board a request to place an individual on the ballot.

Person making this request must provide a written biography for the individual they are proposing to be placed on the ballot.

MSC Board shall provide the requesting individual time at a board meeting to present their case for the candidate.

Points accumulation

It is the shooters responsibility to track all shoot statics and points accumulated towards the Hall of Fame. Shooter has final responsibility to provide documentation for verification, i.e. shoot results or trophies.

MSC Board will then verify all information presented for accuracy.
